

Purpose

The purpose of the <Insert Company> Prohibited and Restricted Use Register is to provide a single and current reference to communicate the details of plant, devices, tooling and associated practices that have been formally recognised as presenting an unacceptable hazard to the <Insert Company> workforce.

Scope

This Register will apply to all <Insert Company> employees and contractors tasked with managing and supervising individuals working at all <Insert Company> operations and provide a definitive reference of Prohibited and Restricted Use items and associated practices.

Requirements






The <Insert Company> Prohibited and Restricted Use Register is a site specific controlled document that will be subject to a scheduled 12 monthly review.

The register will also be reviewed on a non-scheduled basis to reflect the introduction or removal of equipment as determined by learning generated from internal and external sources or by means of risk assessment.

The register is amended by Document Control only after the correct management of change review and endorsement by site responsible personnel.

Site specific and Client restrictions on use of 225mm (9”) grinders Use only 175mm (7”) with “dead mans switch”
	Asbestos materials	Prohibited – Mining, Maintenance, Crushing and Construction departments	Site Safety Management Plan MSIR 1995 Part 9.32, 9.32A DG (transport) Act 1998 Part 3	Synthetic materials available. e.g brake pads, heat resistant applications.
	Hazardous materials not in Hazardous Substance Register or approved by Hazardous Substance Co-ordinator –	Prohibited – Mining, Maintenance, Crushing and Construction departments	Site Safety Management Plan Hazardous Substance Control	All items not listed in Hazardous Substance Register to be risk assessed and signed for approval by the relevant Site Hazardous Substances Coordinator.
	Dangerous weapons such as firearms, hunting knives, swords, bows and crossbows -	Prohibited – Mining, Maintenance, Crushing and Construction departments	Items are considered dangerous / Illegal on site.	Not to be brought onto site. Only can introduced to site under formal approval from Project Manager and the use is restricted.
	Unapproved / Non-modified Vehicle Loading Cranes without client compliance and approval for use	Prohibited – Mining, Maintenance, Crushing and Construction departments	Fatality at Blackwater Mine, April 2002	Project Manager compliance and approval for use shall be attained prior to use.
